Subject driver: Every hour a Musical Experience, exploring sound with awe and wonder

Through our teaching and learning in the music department we aim to create a stimulating and creative environment in which all students can participate. We work to develop skills, knowledge and understanding through a wide variety of practical musical experiences which will also allow students to explore social, moral, cultural and spiritual understanding through experiential learning whilst building cultural capital.

For Rockschool Level 2 Certificate in Performance for Music Practitioners we deliver 3 units at ASA they are:

- 201ta Musical Knowledge (internally assessed) 20%
- 204ta Instrumental Study (internally assessed) 40%
- 202ta Live Performance (externally assessed) 40%

For those certificating in 2022 201ta and 204ta have been graded in year 10.

For those certificating in 2023 201ta will be completed in year 10 and 204ta will be commenced in year 10 but will end in the Autumn term of Year 11. The only unit fully completed in year 11 is 202ta which is externally assessed in the spring term for submission by 1st April.

The autumn term serves as a PPE run of a brief with the 2021 theme: Innovation.

There is no written exam and notes can be used by students in controlled conditions which they have made in their 10 hours preparation time.
