Archbishop Sentamu Academy features heavily in the historic Lions Tour with Mr Grayburn (Head Coach, England Lionesses) and two former ASA students, who play for Hull Kingston Rovers, all featuring as part of the squad.

This Autumn, the England Community Lionesses make history with a first ever tour away from the United Kingdom. A squad of twenty one players will board the plane to Belgrade, on 7th October and return on the 15th October, after playing two tests against the Serbia Women's National side on the 8th and 14th.

The squad sees a real mix of players from across the Women's Community game, including Women's Super League South champions London Broncos, Women's Championship champions Hull Kingston Rovers, Sheffield Eagles, Bedford Tigers, Swinton Lions and many more!

Safeguarding Focus

We have had concerns at the start of term about the extent to which our young people are keeping themselves safe as they make their way to and from school. In particular, we would appreciate parents/carers taking the time to speak to their children about riding a bike safely, using the bicycle lanes only, and always riding their bikes in the same direction as the traffic is flowing. This is particularly a problem on Preston Road at the end of the school day. In addition, some students have

been choosing to give handlebar rides to their friends, which is clearly highly dangerous. We would appreciate it if you could speak to your child to caution them against doing this.

Medical Appointments

To support the school in keeping our children safe, can we kindly request the following whenever your child has an appointment which requires them to leave school early:

- 1. Please let attendance know in advance if your child has an appointment and provide evidence such as medical letters or appointment cards. We know this is not always possible, but if you could try to do this it will help us ensure we are fully aware of the details of the appointment, including what time your child needs to leave school to attend the appointment
- 2. Please try to collect your child for appointments and show proof of ID so we can ensure it is parent/carer before we call the child down. Please don't be offended if you are challenged to provide this proof of your identity, even if the child appears to acknowledge that you are who you say you are.
- 3. If you call the school receptionists with regards to an upcoming appointment, requesting that your child be allowed to leave school to attend, we will also check your identity and make sure it tallies with our records. We will ask you questions to help us confirm you are who you claim to









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be. We do this to make sure we are releasing your child safely into your care.

Reporting a Concern

If you have a concern about a student or anyone else in our school community please report it.
