<p>1635 - Charles used fines and ship tax to raise money without Parliament's agreement. The people were very angry.</p>	<p>1626 - Charles decorates English churches like Catholic ones. People think he's trying to change their religion</p>	<p>1637 - Archbishop Laud introduced a new prayer book to Scotland, and some Scottish people attacked England because they hated it so much.</p>
