

# **Quality of Education Update**

#### Independent Learning Zone (ILZ):

The ILZ is a new Trust wide initiative which we are really excited about. The initiative will allow students to work on independent tasks in all lessons to allow teachers to see what pupils can do on their own and really push students out of their comfort zone and elevate their learning which will have a positive impact on their outcomes.

The initiative has been shared with students and received well; students know that this will enable them to make progress and build resilience and determination by having a go at the hardest tasks on their own before teacher input. Students have been told that the ILZ is to be undertaken in silence and will be completed in a purple pen so they can really concentrate on completing the task to the best of their ability. After the task students will be provided with support and feedback to ensure progress can be made and misconceptions addressed.

The ILZ will fit into the existing learning cycle of:

- Connect
- I Do
- We Do
- You Do

Please encourage your child to really embrace this challenge and show resilience in their lessons to ensure they are getting the most from this exciting initiative.



There is a direct link between attendance and outcomes at the end of school. The more you attend the better your outcomes will be.


